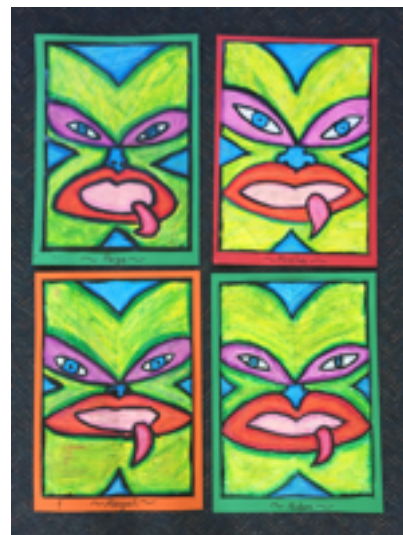
National Young Leaders Day
